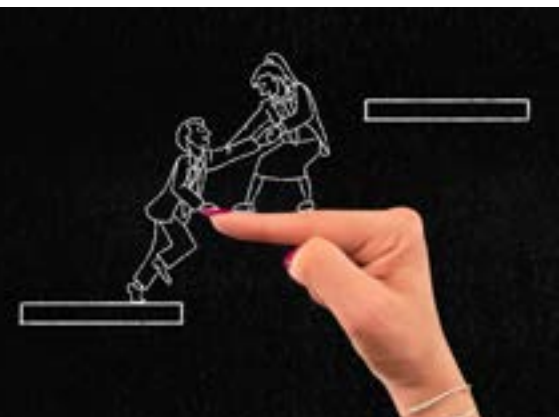

Our approach to supporting each student's success also emphasizes their personal growth and offers personalized, comprehensive pastoral care. We strive to foster respect and acceptance, nurture individuality, create a safe learning environment, and encourage the development of well-rounded, empathetic individuals.

Each tutor group is guided and supported by a tutor who oversees the students' well-being and academic progress. Tutor groups meet daily, which we believe is essential for providing consistent pastoral care and checking in on students' well-being. The tutor develops a strong rapport with the group, fostering an environment where students feel comfortable and confident in communicating.

Each Year Group is led by a Year Team Leader, with support from Student Support Officers and a member of the Year Team Admin.
