## Year 6 Transition Day - Wednesday 2nd July

- **Time:** 8.30am to 3pm
- **Gates:** Vehicles will not be allowed on site unless previously agreed with the LNC or with Mrs Hook. The Bramley Green gate will be open at 8.10am. The front gate, by the field, will open at 8.10am to enable students only, to go to the canteen.
- **Medication** needed by students during the day can be handed to staff on the gate. It must be in a named bag.
- Students **need to wear primary school uniform**.
- **Packed lunch or bring cash for the canteen. £3 is a meal.** A Free School Meal will be provided for students who have this at their primary school. The canteen will take cash on induction day but please do remember that in September the canteen can only be used via money on parent pay.
- Bring a bottle of water and something for break time as the canteen is only being accessed at lunchtime.
