Travel information for Year 11 Students commencing Post-16 education in September 2024

This letter contains information outlining travel options for young people currently in Year 11 and residing in West Sussex, of whom will be attending a school sixth form or an FE college in September 2024.

At Post-16, in most cases it is the responsibility of parents/carers to cover the cost travel. More information, including our Post-16 Transport Policy Statement and discounts, is available on our website at www.westsussex.gov.uk/schooltransport. A summary of travel schemes and available funding are listed below:

Students travelling by rail

- Details of the <u>16-17 railcard</u> are available at <u>www.16-17saver.co.uk</u>. The card costs £30 and gives 50% off the cost of fares.
- Students travelling on the South Coast line may find the Unizone ticket better value. Information is available online from Southern.

Students travelling by bus

Students should contact their local bus operator for details of student discounts. More information, links and how to plan your journey can be found on the Council's school transport website.

16 to 20 Bus Saver

Young people in West Sussex can now get cheaper bus fares until their 21st birthday, by purchasing a 16 to 20 Bus Saver fare or ticket. This will be the same price as the existing child rate from the relevant bus operator. Just ask the bus driver or purchase the fare in the operator apps. Before travelling, make sure to bring a valid proof of age as bus operators may ask for it. For further information, please visit www.westsussex.gov.uk/16to20BusSaver

Where schools are served by dedicated school buses, students may apply
for a paid for concessionary seat. Spare seats on these vehicles may be
offered to sixth form students at a charge of £826 per annum. Please
note, this applies only to closed contract school buses and not to public
service bus routes.

The application form for a 2024/25 Concessionary Seat will be available on the 'Paid school transport' section of the school transport website from the June onwards. Applications should be made by 31 July 2024; any applications received after the deadline may not be processed until after the middle of September.

• Students from families on a low income, or who are 'children looked after,' who need help with travel costs, may receive help from the 16-19 Bursary Fund administered by schools and colleges. Please apply direct to the college or school offering the course.

For those students with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)

Some students with special educational needs and/or disabilities who have an EHCP may require assistance with travel to college or sixth form. To be assessed for travel assistance these students **must apply** by 30 June 2024 to the county council by making a Post-16 application. The application form is at www.westsussex.gov.uk/post-16transport in the Post-16 and college transport section. Applications can be made from 1 May 2024.

Where students with an EHCP are eligible to receive assistance, there is a contribution of £826. Families who are assessed as having a low income do not pay this contribution. The Post-16 policy detailing the criteria for eligibility can be viewed online on the council's website via the link above.
