#### **Career of the Week - Nursing**



You can get into nursing through a university course or an apprenticeship.

You'll usually need: 4 or 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4 (A\* to C), or equivalent, including English, maths and science and 2 or 3 A levels, including a science, or a level 3 diploma in science.

A nurse would usually undertake these duties: take temperatures, blood pressures and pulse rates, give drugs and injections, treat wounds and set up drips, monitor the progress of patients and update records, work with doctors and other healthcare professionals to decide what care to give, give advice to patients and their relatives.


Did you know nursing is the UK's most employable type of degree, with 94% of students getting a job within six months of finishing their course?
