

### **Career of the Week - Dentist**




To become a dentist you'll need to complete a **5-year degree** in dentistry approved by the <u>General Dental Council</u>, followed by 1 to 2 years of postgraduate dental training. When you apply for a dentistry course, you could be asked to take the <u>University Clinical Aptitude</u> <u>Test (UCAT) or BioMedical Admissions Test (BMAT)</u>. You'll usually need: **3 A levels, or equivalent, including biology and chemistry** to undertake a university course to progress into dentistry.

A Dentist will undertake these duties: lead a dental team to diagnose and treat dental problems, see patients for routine check ups, perform treatments like fillings, extractions and fitting dentures and bridges, take X-rays and give local anaesthetics.

"Dentists are the frontline of good oral health. They work with communities to prevent and treat dental/oral disease, correct dental irregularities and treat dental/facial injuries."

## World Braille Day - 4th January 2024

The 4th of January marked the 200th anniversary of Louis Braille's invention. A language that enabled people that could not read text through sight, to read through touch. To mark this occasion a student with vision impairment who uses braille every day, "C" (y9), from Angmering, ran a fantastic lesson, teaching his class mates the alphabet in Braille. The class really enjoyed the introduction into the language of Braille and got to read and answer questions in Braille using a traditional Perkins Brailler. "C"did a terrific job explaining the complex code to his peers and promoted the awareness of an essential language that students with vision impairment need to access all written work. Well done "C"!
