An interpreter is a person who translates speech into different languages, usually at conferences or other meetings.

Interpreters work in many roles, and help people to communicate during GP appointments or police interviews, in war zones, in company meetings, or in politics at meetings involving heads of state and governments.

Some of the things that interpreters love about the job are the chance to hear and speak several languages, very varied work, having to think on their feet, the opportunity to travel and gain an insight into other cultures, working with different colleagues every day, and being able to help people who otherwise could not communicate.

**Road Safety: Cycling**
