IMPORTANT INFORMATION



CANTEEN PAYMENTS

Today the canteen took cash but please do remember that in September the canteen can only be used via money on Parentpay using biometric fingerprint.



BIOMETRIC FINGERPRINTS

The fingerprints will be taken on the first day of term. Consent must be given via the MCAS app. Students with no consent will not be able to use the canteen.



IMAGE CONSENT

Consent is needed to allow your child to be photographed in school (eg. lessons, activities, trips) and these may be used online or in publications.



MEDICATION CONSENT

Consent is needed to allow us to administer paracetamol, ibuprofen, adrenaline or antihistamines if required.



Please note that students will not be able to have their photographs taken in September or use the canteen unless consent has been granted.

All consents can be done via the MCAS app.

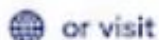

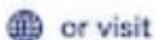
