Year 9 Peer Support Team



A number of the Year 9 Peer Support Team met with other secondary schools online regarding the theme of 'Stories of Sanctuary: Understanding Displacement Through Student Voices'. It is the first time that The Angmering School has been involved in this WSCC student voice scheme. This is linked to our expansion of student leadership roles.

Student Evangeline Blaker representing the Year 9 Peer Support Team wrote the following summary -

'The meeting with the Peer Support Team representatives and other schools was really interesting because of the message that was made with the analogy of a plant in new soil. How we should consider that the people who come here from Afghanistan are in an entirely new country and that in order to help them grow and succeed in their lives here we need to make their lives easier and be kind to them so that they can feel welcome.

Another thing was how the answers to the questions that were sent in before the meeting made us aware of how their lives before, during, and after being in England were and how they were treated badly at times but how their schools and school systems helped them feel welcome and gain friends.'

Southern School Book Awards

Seven enthusiastic readers from Years 9 and 10 enjoyed an inspiring visit to the Southern Schools Book Awards author event at Hurstpierpoint College recently.

The after-school trip gave students the exciting opportunity to hear five talented authors speak about their books and creative journeys. A particular highlight of the evening was watching acclaimed illustrator and former Children's Laureate Chris Riddell create live drawings as the discussion unfolded. Students were captivated and amused by seeing his illustrations take shape in real time, adding an extra layer of magic to the event.

The chance to meet the authors and have books signed made the experience even more special. Students described the event as "really fun" and "a lovely event," praising both the welcoming atmosphere and the inclusive nature of the trip. They were particularly inspired to see so many school children from a wide variety of other schools showing their support for the authors featured.

Overall, it was a thoroughly enjoyable and memorable experience for everyone involved, celebrating reading, creativity and a shared love of books.

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
